




FY23 Revenue By Art Form







OUR IMPACT

Becoming a Leader in the Arts in Kentucky

Some of the highlights from our program impacts this fiscal year include:

- Our artAbility Initiative is reaching the disability community by inculcating best practices to make our programs more accessible.
- The Small Town America Institute for Rural Arts & Culture is creating connectivity between Appalachian and rural American arts centers, leveraging lessons that can be used to help others making arts accessible in rural America.
- The 2023 Student Art Show, "Bluegrass, Brushstrokes, and Beyond," had a record number of entries: 788 pieces were entered by students from 35 Kentucky counties. Winners will be displayed at the State Fair in August.
- The ArtX Gallery, a new gallery this year, has facilitated a professional art exhibition space for six emerging artists from the region.

Mount Sterling, Kentucky

New in 2023, the Eastern Kentucky Academy provides over 125 classes, workshops, and ensembles that create free and low-cost arts learning opportunities for youth and adults in the region. In its first year, our Academy reached 5,000 individuals from 33 Kentucky counties.

An Intimate Evening With... Series

Through this series, literary and artistic luminaries with ties to Kentucky are invited to share their work and insights with audiences in the Gateway region. This not only provides an opportunity for local residents to engage with new and exciting perspectives, but also helps to foster a sense of community and connection through the literary arts.

Some of the notable figures who have participated in the "An Intimate Evening with" series include:

The Art of Recovery

Through a partnership with the Montgomery County Health Department, we have provided guided art lessons to the Montgomery County Regional Jail inmates once per week. In each lesson, we engage inmates in a recovery-based session with an art activity integrated with evidence-based behavioral health principles using "SMART" Rehabilitation Curriculum. This program is co-led by a facilitator trained in substance abuse recovery methods from the MCHD alongside a credentialed adult art educator from GRAC. The co-facilitators meet regularly to crosswalk the artistic activities with the lessons on recovery, creating a deeper connection to the material and engendering more meaningful comprehension and application of the content. The program's pilot was so successful, an expansion is in the works to include individuals who are in active recovery upon release from incarceration.





Super Saturdays STEAM Education Program

Super Saturdays are a great way for youth to explore the fascinating intersection of art and science. These workshops are held once per month on a Saturday morning, making them accessible to busy families. The STEAM curriculum is designed to be both fun and educational, providing an engaging learning experience for kids. Each workshop is led by experienced instructors who are passionate about science and art education. Each month's class is centered on an exciting topic (superheroes, dinosaurs, slime, Disney, and more), making these workshops a great way to encourage kids to develop an interest in STEAM subjects. Education research shows that integrating creativity into STEM can lead youth to exciting career opportunities down the road.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library

This year, the Gateway Regional Arts Center has teamed up with the Early Childhood Council of Montgomery County to serve as the county-wide sponsor for Dolly Parton's Imagination Library. The program provides a monthly picture book to children under the age of five. Within the first six months of launching the program, over 2,500 books have been sent to young readers throughout Montgomery County. Through this program, the Gateway Regional Arts Center is able to provide access to high-quality literature to children from low-income households who may not otherwise have access to books, building a strong foundation for future academic success and fosters a love of reading from an early age.


